

2009 CASCADE LAKE REGULATIONS

Welcome to Cascade Lake. We hope that your time with us is most enjoyable. To that end, and for your protection and benefit, management respectfully requests cooperation with the following enacted Lake regulations and recommendations.

I. GENERAL

- a) The park remains open seven (7) days per week during season from 10:00 to 6:00 on weekdays and from 10:00AM to 7:00PM on weekends and holidays. The only exception is closure precipitated by factors beyond management's control.
- b) Cascade Lake **does not** issue rain checks or refunds.
- c) The swimming hours are from 10:00AM to 5:30PM weekdays; 10:00AM to 6:30PM weekends and holidays.
- d) The large waterslide (150 foot) operates from 11:00AM to 5:00PM weekdays and from Noon until 6:00PM on weekends and holidays.
- e) The Spray 'N' Playground operates from 10:00AM to 4:00 PM weekdays and Noon to 6:00PM on the weekends and holidays.
- f) Lifeguards are on duty during swimming hours.
The main park gates close at 6:00 PM weekdays and 7:00PM weekends and holidays.

II. WHAT'S PERMITTED IN THE PARK?; WHAT'S NOT?

- a) Food and beverage of choice from the outside are permitted. This does not include the use of outside delivery service.
- b) Smoking is permitted in designated areas provided that certain conditions are met. Smokers must use ash trays. They may not throw cigarette butts on the ground, in the lake or in the stream. Smoking is prohibited in the restrooms, the concession stand, the Spray 'N' Playground and the arcade. Ashtrays can be acquired from the concession stand for a deposit of \$2.00
- c) Since Cascade Lake attempts to provide a trash free environment, proper disposal of refuse is required. Trash receptacles are strategically located throughout the grounds; they should be used.
- d) Spitting in the lake or on the grounds is forbidden.
- e) In keeping with Cascade Lake's mission as a family oriented park, patrons should be mindful of their language, behavior and anything else that could infringe on the rights of others to have a safe, healthy, and enjoyable environment.
- f) Glass is not permitted on the beach or Lake vicinity.
- g) ***Pets are not permitted*** at any time.
- h) Outside boats, including inflatables, are not permitted.
- i) Changing clothes or baby diapers is allowed in the bathhouse only.
- j) Skateboards, in-line skates and bicycles are not allowed to be used in the park.

III. WHAT'S PERMITTED ABOUT THE LAKE AREA?; WHAT'S NOT?

- a) Swimming is allowed within the roped area only.
- b) Horseplay, such as running, shoving, or dunking is not allowed.

- c) Hanging on ropes is forbidden.
- d) Patrons should refrain from swimming under piers and platforms.
- e) No jumping from the piers or decking when crowded.
- f) Posted load limits on the high jump platform should be observed. Only one person at a time is allowed on the middle and top platforms of the high jump.
- g) Spitting, undue disturbance, abusive or profane language or breach of the peace are to be avoided. Remember this is a family park.
- h) Glass containers are ***strictly prohibited*** on the beach, piers, platforms and general lake area.
- i) Food and/or beverages are not allowed in the Lake.
- j) Climbing or sitting on lifeguard stands is not permitted.

IV. **WHAT'S PERMITTED ON THE WATERSLIDES?; WHAT'S NOT?**

- a) Only one rider at a time is allowed on all slides.
- b) Only one person at a time on the tube slide platform and ladder.
- c) On all slides, riders must descend feet first and on the back.
- d) Stopping, standing or twirling within the slide is not permitted.
- e) No lifejackets, hats, sunglasses, loose jewelry or exposed metal on clothing are allowed on the slides.
- f) Riders should exit the splashdown areas of all slides as soon as possible.
- g) In order to use the 150 foot flume, riders must be 48" or more in height.
- h) Users of the 150 foot flume should wait behind the line until signaled by the attendant.
- i) Spectators are not allowed on the stairway to the 150 foot flume, in the splashdown areas or on the exit pier when crowded.
- j) Users of the 150 foot flume should exit the splashdown area straight ahead to the dock or toward the concession stand.
- k) With prior approval from management, photographers may be allowed on the exit pier (based on crowd size).
- l) During the operational hours of the 150 foot flume, the exit pier is for slide users only.
- m) Individuals with health problems that could be aggravated and women in advanced pregnancy should be aware of possible danger.

V. **SWIMMING**

- a) Children under 8 years of age may use the shallow water area only when accompanied in the water by an adult (18 years or older) who must remain with them at all times.
- b) Children under 8 years of age are not permitted to use the deep water area.
- c) Children under 12 years of age must be accompanied by an adult (18 years or older) at all times while on the Lake property.
- d) Patrons will not be permitted to use the deep water unless they can comply with our minimum standards for water safety. Patrons 20 and under must pass Cascade Lake's swimming test thereby demonstrating their ability. This test must be administered by a lifeguard on duty and a wristband will be issued upon successful completion indicating that the patron may use the deep water.

- e) Persons wearing long pants, full dress, or any heavy clothing are not permitted in the deep water.

VI. DIVING

- a) Diving is permitted from the main pier.
- b) Diving is permitted from the sides of the low platform.
- c) Diving is ***not*** allowed from the swimming pool decking.
- d) Diving is ***not*** allowed from the sunbathing pier.
- e) Diving is ***not*** allowed from the high jump platform.

VII. WATER GAMES AND PLAY EQUIPMENT

- a) Water games (frisbee, ball, etc) are permitted unless overcrowding occurs, at which time management may temporarily suspend such use.
- b) Life preservers, inner-tubes, water wings and play equipment may be used in the swimming areas unless overcrowding occurs, at which time management may temporarily suspend such use.

VIII. RESPONSIBILITY - Patrons are responsible for and will be held accountable for their behavior. Specifically:

- a) The cost of any property damage will be charged to the responsible party.
- b) Management is not responsible for loss or damage to any personal property.
- c) Adults will be held responsible and accountable for the children in their care.
